From Your President

Weavers working today owe a debt of gratitude to those who have come before us. This year, museums around the world, from the Tate Modern in London (<https://www.tate.org.uk/whats-on/tate-modern/exhibition/anni-albers>) to the Harvard Art Museums in Massachusetts (<https://www.harvardartmuseums.org/article/women-and-weaving-at-the-bauhaus>), are celebrating the weavers of the Bauhaus School, founded in 1919 in Weimar, Germany. I want to highlight two of these exhibits.

The Bauhaus School was short lived, closing in 1933 due to political pressure, but it had a broad influence on modern art, architecture, and textiles. The female students of the Bauhaus were discouraged from studying painting, sculpture, or other art forms. (Founder Walter Gropius' opinion was that men could think in three dimensions but the "beautiful" sex could only handle two.) Instead, women were placed in the weaving classes and there they excelled. Students and teachers included Annie Albers, Gunta Stölzl, Otto Burger, Benita Koch-Otte, and Gertrude Arndt. I encourage you to search the internet for "Bauhaus Textiles" to see examples of their work.

Or if you can, go to one of the many exhibitions celebrating the Bauhaus. I was fortunate to be in Chicago last week to see "Weaving Beyond the Bauhaus" at the Art Institute of Chicago. (<https://www.artic.edu/exhibitions/9251/weaving-beyond-the-bauhaus>) This exhibit featured the work of many Bauhaus weavers as well as some of those who were influenced by them, such as Sheila Hicks, Lenore Tawney and Ethel Stein.

Another exhibit, recently closed, at the Craft in America Center in Los Angeles featured work inspired by Annie Albers, "Material Meaning: a Living Legacy of Annie Albers." (<https://www.craftinamerica.org/exhibition/material-meaning>). Included in this exhibit was a piece by Jennifer Moore. Yes ... that Jennifer Moore, the weaver who will be visiting Northwest Arkansas to lead a double weave workshop for our guild and to provide the program at our November meeting.

I hope to see everyone on November 9, 10am, Shiloh Meeting Hall, to hear Jennifer Moore's presentation.
